

## MANCHESTER ROAD GREAT STREET COMMITTEE

**June 2, 2014**

The regular meeting of the Great Streets Committee held at the West St. Louis County Chamber of Commerce offices, was called to order by Chairman Craig Larson at 3:30 p.m.

The Committee voted to approve the minutes for the meeting of May 5<sup>th</sup>.

As a representative from MODOT was not present, the group moved to continue the discussion regarding the bids.

Dr. Larson indicated he would bring the Chamber GMM survey results to the next meeting. He added that at first glance the survey results were positive. He also added that the attendees seemed to be in support of splitting the Committee into two parts. The larger group would meet on a quarterly basis to discuss potential projects, such as marketing. While city staff would meet more often to continue the necessary work on specific projects.

Mayor Woerther summarized conversations he had with the Mayor of Winchester and Manchester. It was decided that an invitation would be extended to both cities after the current 2014 project was (let) underway.

The group agreed to meet whenever MoDOT was available to discuss the bid status and updates. However, the group also decided to set a meeting date on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

Wildwood engineer Ryan Thomas requested a letter of support from the Committee for their TAP application. The application would be for funds to build a new pedestrian bridge further

west of the existing pedestrian bridge and still within the Great Streets Master Plan boundaries.  
The group unanimously voted to in favor of providing a support letter.

The meeting adjourned at 3:57 PM.
